

On this date the undersigned issued the Initial Determination on violation of section 337, containing the following conclusions:

1. The Commission has subject matter, personal, and *in rem* jurisdiction in this investigation.
2. The importation requirement is satisfied.
3. Respondents' accused products infringe asserted claims 1, 3, 4, 6, 8, 22, 24, 25, 26, 29, 32, 33, and 34 of U.S. Patent No. 7,151,283 ("the '283 patent").
4. Respondents' accused products do not infringe asserted claims 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, or 17 of U.S. Patent No. 7,271,425 ("the '425 patent").
5. It has not been shown by clear and convincing evidence that any asserted claim of the '283 or '425 patent is invalid.
6. The domestic industry requirement is satisfied as to all asserted patents.


